Results show that the school is performing above National average in level 4 or above in reading and maths, but, below in writing at level 4+.

It also shows that children are above in achieving level 5+ in reading, writing and maths and achieving 4b+ in combined reading, writing and maths.

The school appears slightly below National Average (90%) for 2 levels progress for Mathematics (89%), however, the cohort is significantly small (9 children) and this should be taken into consideration.

## **Phonics Screening:**

Children in Year 1 in 2014-15 made exceptional progress in their learning of Phonics.

94% of Year 1 children were 'Working at' the standard when they were tested during the phonics screening test week. The National Average for Phonics Screening was 77%. The statistics show that our school was well above the National Average.
