Summary of Analysis:

The majority of the responses indicate that parents generally have a positive opinion of Collective Worship at Our Lady Star of the Sea Primary School with a very small minority being unsure about elements of Collective Worship.

Generally, parents feel that the prayer life of the school is a positive experience and that their children can talk about prayer and belonging to a community.

What parents would like to see improved:

- Some parents felt that there were not enough opportunities to attend Mass in school Response: I have discussed this with Fr Neylan and he has agreed to have a school/parish Mass in school once per month. This would be on the first Wednesday of the month unless there is a specific Holy Day of Obligation –in which case the Mass would be on the Holy Day. (Parents will be informed by Newsletter and Our-SchoolsApp of dates and Mass times.)
- Some parents felt that they needed more information on worship and prayers Response: The Collective Worship policy (which includes an appendices containing prayers) is available on the school website. In addition the school has produced this booklet containing some of the main prayers said in school.

Wednesday Word also provide a guide to family prayer.

- All children should receive a blessing even if they are not of the Catholic faith Response: The priest gives children blessings during Mass—this is normally given as a general blessing before Holy Communion is given out. Children are also reminded that if they wish to receive a blessing during Holy Communion they should cross their arms over their chests as they approach the priest. No child should feel excluded and blessings are for all pupils, staff and parents who attend Mass. Please note that it is only the priest who is able to give blessings.
- Children should do a little bit about Collective Worship at home Response: To support prayer and collective worship at home children receive the Wednesday Word (this is a guide for families to reflect on the gospel and pray together.) In addition to this the school sends out Travelling Cribs during Advent and will send out a Travelling Rosary in May —these support family prayer and provide a focus and guide to help families pray together.
- ◆ Homework to be given—prize for best presentation Response: The school has introduced a Wednesday Word book—in which children can reflect on gospel readings. At the end of each year teachers will nominate children for an RE award based on the progress or depth of understanding demonstrated in the children's homework.
- give more information to parents Response: The school's RE and Collective Worship Policy is located on the school website—any parent wishing to have a hard copy of these policies should contact the school office. In addition each term an outline of what the children will be covering in RE is sent out to parents and can also be viewed on the school website. The Headteacher and class teacher are happy to provide any other information that parents feel that they need.
- be able to attend more personal/class based events Response: The school is mindful of working parents and endeavours to strike a balance on the demands of those parents.
 However, Special Christmas and Easter performances/ assemblies are planned and parents are welcome to attend those events.




