Create a menu for a Stone Age restaurant.</p>	<p><b>Create your own stone age cave paintings!</b></p> <p>First, research them if you can, on the internet. Find a stone and some paints and try and recreate them. Write a description of the paintings and explain why you think Stone Age man made them.</p> <p><b>Everything Else</b></p> <p>Thought of something else? It still counts!
