R.E.- 'New Life'- Lessons 5 and 6

<u>New Life</u>	<i>Learning</i>	<i>Activity</i>
<u>Lesson 5</u>	<p>Look at RE LF4 PowerPoint. Look at the painting of the conversion on the way to Damascus by Caravaggio. What is happening in this painting? Discuss the painting of St. Paul. Tell the children that Paul wasn't always called Paul, he was a devout Pharisee who originally was called Saul. Read 'Story of Paul' worksheet</p>	<p>Draw 2 pictures and annotate them. Draw a picture of Saul. Annotate with adjectives to describe his character. Then draw picture of Paul and annotate with different adjectives to describe his character. Some children should make their descriptions more detailed to include actions. Some children could give reasons for the actions of Saul and Paul.</p>
<u>Lesson 6</u>	<p>END OF TOPIC WORK The Holy Spirit gave Paul new life and happiness. Read 2 Corinthians 6:3-10 What do you think Paul expected when he set off on his journeys? What happened to him? How do you think he was able to cope? What part of the letter did you like best? Why?</p>	<p>How do you think we might live if we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us? Thought for the Day is a short reflection broadcast every day on Radio 4. It is based on a religious issue, belief or question. You have been invited to speak on the programme for about 2 minutes and the title you have been given is – 'A whole new way of living'. Children must write a short script showing how belief in the Good News and the power of the Holy Spirit shapes the lives of Christians today. How do we act because we are filled with the Holy Spirit? Use St Paul's letter to the Galatians (also on the sheet) to help you. Some children should explain how this links to St. Paul. Some children could give reasons for these actions. If possible, read out your script as if you're on Radio 4. Any videos of this can be sent to me to see – I would love to hear them!</p>
