In Science this term, we will be learning all about Animals, including Humans. The children will explore the five key food groups and learn how a balanced diet helps us to stay healthy. We will also investigate the human body, focusing on the skeleton and muscles, and discovering how they work together to support movement and protect our organs. This exciting topic will help the children build their understanding of how living things grow, move, and stay strong.





P.E. will take place for <u>Class 3 on a Tuesday and a Thursday</u>. Children will need to attend school on these days in their PE kit. Please ensure that children have appropriate clothing to take part in PE lessons in different weather, especially as it starts to become colder at this time of year. Our topics this term are rugby and tennis.

We have Easington Sports Partnership paying us a visit each Thursday to work with Class Three, teaching them valuable skills when playing rugby.


Dear Parents / Carers,




we will be moving onto our Geography topic 'Journey of the River'. Locating different rivers, in particular the Tyne, Wear and Tees.
