
In Science, we will learn about Living Things; exploring how plants reproduce and learning about the life cycles of the different animal groups.


'How the Grinch Stole Christmas'. Our writing activities will include a portal story, non-fiction writing (such as a newspaper report and instructions) and pieces of poetry.

In History, we will be learning about 'Conflict Through Time'; exploring developments with weapons, learning about invasions and looking at key tactics that have been used throughout time—right from the Prehistoric era up until WW2.

In Geography, we will be studying Biomes. Within this unit of work, we will take a closer look at Tropical Rainforests, explore deforestation and learn about sustainable management.



In Maths, we will be looking at Place Value, before moving onto addition and subtraction. This will include looking at formal written methods (column method) and practicing our mental addition and subtraction. We will then move onto multiplication and division, including multiplication and division facts.







Through our prayer and worship, we continue to celebrate key events across the liturgical year. These Celebrations of the Word will take place in class during the week.

Towards the end of this term, we will also begin our preparations for Advent as we ready ourselves to reflect on the coming of Jesus into the world.
